

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

This sewing machine is designed and manufactured for household use only.

Read all instructions before using this sewing machine.

DANGER— To reduce the risk of electric shock:

1. An appliance should never be left unattended when plugged in. Always unplug this sewing machine from the electric outlet immediately after using and before cleaning

WARNING— To reduce the risk of burns, fire, electric shock, or injury to persons:

- 1. Do not allow to be used as a toy. Close attention is necessary when this sewing machine is used by or near children.
- 2. Use this appliance only for its intended use as described in this owner's manual.

 Use only attachments recommended by the manufacturer as contained in this owner's manual.
- Never operate this sewing machine if it has a damaged cord or plug, if it is not working properly, if it has been dropped or damaged, or dropped into water.
 Return this sewing machine to the nearest authorized dealer or service center for examination, repair, electrical or mechanical adjustment.
- 4. Never operate the appliance with any air opening blocked. Keep ventilation openings of this sewing machine and foot controller free from accumulation of lint, dust and loose cloth.
- 5. Never drop or insert any object into any opening.
- 6. Do not use outdoors.
- 7. Do not operate where aerosol (spray) products are being used or where oxygen is being administered.
- 8. To disconnect, turn all controls to the off ("O") position, then remove plug from outlet.
- 9. Do not unplug by pulling on cord. To unplug, grasp the plug, not the cord.
- Keep fingers away from all moving parts. Special care is required around the sewing machine needle and/or cutting blade.
- 11. Always use the proper needle plate. The wrong plate can cause the needle to break.
- 12. Do not use bent needles.
- 13. Do not pull or push fabric while stitching. It may deflect the needle causing it to break.
- 14. Switch this sewing machine off ("O") when making any adjustment in the needle area, such as threading the needle, changing the needle, threading the bobbin or changing the presser foot, and the like.
- 15. Always unplug this sewing machine from the electrical outlet when removing covers, lubricating, or when making any other adjustments mentioned in this owner's manual.

Accessory Storage


The accessories can be conveniently stored in the compartments of the extension table.

To store the accessories in the compartment of the extension table, hook your fingers in the hollow on the left side of the extension table. Push up the cover towards you to open the accessory storage.

- (1) Needle plate
- (2) Automatic buttonhole foot R
- (3) Bobbin
- (4) Touch screen stylus
- (5) Stitch reference chart
- (6) Extra spool pin

CAUTION:

Do not place the needle plate upside down otherwise the needle plate may break or cause malfunction.



Extension Table

The extension table provides an extended sewing area and can be removed for free-arm sewing.

- (1) Extension table
- (2) Free-arm

To detach:

Draw the table out to the left.


To attach:

Slide the table on the base and push the table to the right.

Free-arm Sewing

Free-arm sewing is used for stitching sleeves, waistbands, pant legs or any other tubular garments. It is also useful for darning socks or mending knees or elbows.


(2) Free-arm



Foot Control and Thread Cutter Switch (optional)

To attach the foot control and the thread cutter switch to the base plate, tighten setscrews A, and setscrews B with washers as shown.

- (1) Foot control
- (2) Thread cutter switch
- (3) Base plate
- (4) Setscrew A
- (5) Setscrew B
- (6) Washer



Adjusting the Thread Cutter Switch Position Placing the thread cutter switch to the left


The thread cutter switch position can be adjusted for your convenience.

If you wish to attach the thread cutter switch to the left side of the foot control, follow the procedure below.

NOTE:

A Phillips head screwdriver is not included with this machine.

- **1.** Remove the setscrews A, B and washers with a Phillips head screwdriver.
 - Setscrew A
 - (2) Setscrew B
 - (3) Washer
- 2. Turn the base plate 180 degrees.
- 3. Attach the foot control and thread cutter switch with the setscrews and the washers. Tighten the setscrews A and B. Be sure that the cable is not caught between the foot control and the base plate.
 - (1) Setscrew A
 - (2) Setscrew B
 - (3) Washer



Adjusting the horizontal position of the thread cutter switch


- 1. Loosen the setscrews B under the switch.
 - (1) Setscrew B
 - (2) Washer

2. Slide the switch to the left or right, and fix it at the desired position by tightening the setscrews with a screwdriver.

Adjusting the vertical position of the thread cutter switch

- 1. Remove the setscrews B and washers.
- 2. Move the switch forward or backward, attach the switch at the desired position and fix it with the setscrews and washers.
 - (1) Setscrew B
 - (2) Washer
 - (3) Desired position

- To fix the thread cutter switch at its lowest position, fix the setscrews B into the hole (4), and then holes (5).
- Tighten the setscrews B securely.
- Peel off the backing paper from the rubber sole (6) and attach it to the bottom of the thread cutter switch as shown.



GETTING READY TO SEW

Connecting the Power Supply

Using start/stop button

- 1. First make sure the power switch is OFF.
- **2.** Insert the machine plug of the power supply cable into the machine socket.
- **3.** Insert the power supply plug into the wall outlet, and turn the power switch ON.
 - (1) Power switch
 - (2) Machine socket
 - (3) Machine plug
 - (4) Power supply plug
 - (5) Wall outlet

NOTE:

- Make sure to use the power supply cable that came with the machine.
- If you turn OFF the power switch, wait for 5 seconds before turning it on again.

⚠ WARNING:

- While in operation, always keep your eyes on the sewing area, and do not touch any moving parts such as the thread take-up lever, handwheel or needle.
- Always turn OFF the power switch and unplug the machine from the power supply:
 - when leaving the machine unattended.
 - when cleaning the machine.
- · Do not place anything on the foot control.

Before using your sewing machine

Before using your sewing machine for the first time, place a scrap of fabric under the presser foot and run the machine for a few minutes.


Wipe away any oil which may appear.

Operating instructions:

The symbol "O" on the switch indicates the "OFF" position of the switch.

For the U.S.A. and Canada only

Polarized plug (one blade wider than the other): To reduce the risk of electric shock, this plug is intended to fit in a polarized outlet only one way. If it does not fit fully in the outlet, reverse the plug. If it still does not fit, contact a qualified electrician to install the proper outlet. Do not modify the plug in any way.



Using foot control

If you wish to use the foot control, insert the pin connector into the jack on the machine.


- 1. First make sure the power switch is OFF.
- 2. Insert the machine plug of the power supply cable into the machine socket.
- **3.** Insert the pin connector into the foot control jack on the machine.
- **4.** Insert the power supply plug into the wall outlet, and turn the power switch ON.

 - (2) Machine plug
 - (3) Machine socket
 - (4) Pin connector
 - (5) Foot control jack
 - (6) Power supply plug
 - (7) Wall outlet

NOTE:

- The start/stop button does not work when the foot control is connected except variable zigzag sewing.
- Connect the foot control when sewing the variable zigzag sewing (refer to page 63).

Operating Instructions:

Foot control model YC-485EC-1 (YDK) is for use with this sewing machine.




Using optional foot control

If you wish to use the optional foot control, pull out the cord from the foot control and insert the pin connector into the foot control jack on the machine.

- 1. First make sure the power switch is OFF.
- 2. Insert the machine plug of the power supply cable into the machine socket.
- **3.** Pull out the cord from the foot control and insert the pin connector into the foot control jack on the machine.
- **4.** Insert the power supply plug into the wall outlet, and turn the power switch ON.
 - (1) Power switch
 - (2) Machine plug
 - (3) Machine socket
 - (4) Pin connector
 - (5) Foot control jack
 - (6) Power supply plug
 - (7) Wall outlet

NOTE:


- The start/stop button does not work when the foot control is connected except variable zigzag sewing.
- Connect the foot control when sewing the variable zigzag sewing (refer to page 63).



Cord storage

The cord of the foot control can be conveniently stored in the cord storage under the base cover of the foot control.


- (1) Base cover
- (2) Cord
- (3) Hooks



Using optional thread cutter switch

If you wish to use the optional thread cutter switch, insert the pin connector of the thread cutter switch into the jack on the foot control (optional), and insert the pin connector of the foot control into the foot control jack on the machine.

- 1. First make sure the power switch is OFF.
- 2. Remove the cable tie from the cable.
- **3.** Insert the pin connector (thread cutter switch) into the jack on the foot control.
- 4. Flip the foot control upside down and open the cover.
- **5.** Draw the cord from the foot control and insert the pin connector (foot control) into the foot control jack on the machine.
- **6.** Insert the power supply plug into the wall outlet, and turn the power switch ON.
 - (1) Power switch
 - (2) Cable tie
 - (3) Pin connector (thread cutter switch)
 - (4) Jack on the foot control
 - (5) Pin connector (foot control)
 - (6) Foot control jack
 - (7) Machine plug
 - (8) Wall outlet




After sewing, depress the thread cutter switch on the right side of the foot control to trim both the needle and bobbin threads.

Do not depress the thread cutter switch until the start/ stop button turns blue.

- (1) Thread cutter switch
- (2) Start/stop button

- Threads are trimmed when the thread cutter switch is depressed for more than 0.5 seconds.
- The thread cutter switch does not work without the foot control being depressed first.
- Bundle the cables with the cable tie as necessary.
 - (3) Cable tie



Controlling sewing speed

Speed control slider

You can limit the maximum sewing speed with the speed control slider according to your sewing needs.


To increase the sewing speed, move the slider to the right.

To decrease the sewing speed, move the slider to the left.

The sewing speed can be changed while stitching.

Maximum sewing speed in the embroidery mode is displayed on the Ready to Sew window.

(1) Maximum sewing speed




Foot Control

Pressing on the foot control can vary sewing speed.

The harder you press the foot control, the faster the machine runs.

For variable zigzag sewing, refer to page 63.

- The machine runs at the maximum speed set by the speed control slider when the foot control is fully depressed.
- You can select the desired start-up speed from 1 to 5 by pressing the corresponding key (refer to page 171).
- This machine is equipped with an automatic shutdown safety feature to prevent overheating whenever the machine is running overloaded. Follow the safety instructions that appear on the visual touch screen (refer to page 186).



Machine Operating Buttons

(1) Start/stop button

Press this button to start or stop the machine. The machine starts running slowly for the first few stitches, then runs at the speed set by the speed control slider. The machine runs slowly as long as this button is pressed.

The button will turn red when the machine is running, and blue when it has been stopped.

Pressing and holding this button while sewing will slow down the sewing speed and the machine will stop when the button is released.

NOTE:

- The start/stop button cannot be used when the foot control is connected to the machine.
- You can select the desired start-up speed from 1 to 5 by pressing the corresponding key (refer to page 171).

(2) Reverse button

· When the following stitch patterns are selected:

| Utility | Quilt | Bridge |

The machine will sew in reverse as long as the reverse button is pressed. Release the button to sew forward. When the machine is stopped and foot control is disconnected, the machine will sew in reverse slowly as long as the reverse button is pressed. Release the button to stop the machine.

When any other stitches are selected:

If you press the reverse button when sewing any other patterns, the machine will immediately sew locking stitches and automatically stop. When the reverse button is pressed while the machine is stopped, the machine will immediately sew locking stitches and automatically stop after the machine is started.

NOTE:

There will be particular functions of the reverse button when stitch pattern U2, U3, B13 or B14 is selected. Refer to pages 46-47, 76 and 78 for instructions.

(3) Auto-lock button

· When the following stitch patterns are selected:

Press the auto-lock button to sew a locking stitch immediately. The machine will automatically stop. When the auto-lock button is pressed while the machine is stopped, the machine will immediately sew locking stitches and automatically stop after the machine is started.

When any other stitches are selected:

Press the auto-lock button to sew a locking stitch at the end of current pattern. The machine will automatically stop.

When the machine is stopped, press the auto-lock button to sew a locking stitch at the end of current pattern and the machine will automatically stop after the machine is started.

The machine will trim the threads automatically after locking the stitch when the auto thread cutting is turned on (refer to page 170).

(4) Needle up/down button


Press this button to bring the needle bar up or down. The machine will stop with the needle in down position. However, you can change the needle stop position in the machine setting mode (refer to page 170).

(5) Thread cutter button

After finishing sewing, press this button to trim the threads. The needle bar automatically rises after trimming the threads (refer to page 43).

After using auto thread cutting or threading the bobbin holder, you can start sewing without drawing up the bobbin thread.

- · The thread cutter button does not function:
- directly after turning ON the power.
- when the presser foot is raised with the presser foot lifter.
- after being pressed 3 times in a row.
- Use the thread cutter on the face cover if the thread is #30 or thicker (refer to page 43).





Touch Screen Keys



Do not press the visual touch screen with hard or sharp objects like pencils or screwdrivers. Use touch screen stylus included in the standard accessories.

(1) Home key (refer to page 117)

Press this key to go to the top of the category selections for the ordinary sewing mode or the embroidery mode window.

(2) Mode switch key

Press this key to switch the ordinary sewing mode or embroidery mode.

(3) Open file key (refer to pages 162-165)

Press this key and the open file window will open.

You can open pattern combinations and monograms saved in the machine's internal memory or on a USB flash drive.

(4) Set mode key (refer to pages 166-178)

Press this key to enter the setting mode. You can customize the machine settings to your preference.

The settings for "Machine Settings", "Ordinary Sewing Settings", "Embroidery Settings", and "Language Setting" are available in this mode.

(5) Help key (refer to page 18)

Press this key and the help window will open.

(6) Lockout key

Press this key to lockout the machine when threading the machine, replacing the accessories, etc.

To reduce the risk of injury, all the buttons and keys except the lockout key are deactivated.

To unlock the machine, press this key again.

(7) Cursor keys

Press the cursor keys to move the cursor, the embroidery hoop or designs in editing window, etc.

(8) Stitch width adjustment keys (refer to pages 40, 55, 64, 70, 85, 99, etc.)

Press the "+" or "-" key to alter the stitch width or needle drop position of the selected pattern.

(9) Stitch length adjustment keys (refer to pages 41, 64, 70, 77, 79, 99, etc.)


Press the "+" or "-" key to alter the stitch length of the selected stitch pattern.

(10) Manual stitch setting window (refer to pages 40-41)

Recommended presser foot pressure value and needle thread tension are displayed on the window.

The stitch width and stitch length or needle drop position of the selected pattern are also displayed. You can alter those settings with the stitch length/width adjustment key.

Press the default key to recover the original stitch setting.



(11) Function key (refer to pages 38-39)

You can change sewing settings for the selected pattern to suit your personal preference.

(12) Stitch category name and page

You can see the stitch category name and pages.

(13) Pattern selection keys

Press this key to sew the desired pattern directly.

(14) Category selection keys (refer to pages 36-37)

Press these keys to select the desired stitch category.

(15) Page keys (refer to pages 120, 143)

Press the page keys to display the next page or previous page. In embroidery mode, you can switch embroidery patterns or layers.

(16) Presser foot

The presser foot suitable for typical sewing of the selected pattern is displayed.


The presser foot varies depending on the purpose of sewing.

(17) Preview

The images of selected stitch patterns are shown in the edit box.

(18) Startover key (refer to page 100)

If you stop sewing in the middle of a stitch pattern and wish to sew the pattern again from the beginning, press this key before you start sewing.



Help Screen

Press the help key to show the help window. You can check the QR code, software version of the machine, machine ID, total power-on time of the machine, and total operating time of the machine.



Read the QR code to see the instructional video, stitch chart (ordinary), design chart (embroidery) and quick reference chart.

Press the machine ID copy key to save the machine ID (machineID.txt) to the USB flash drive inserted in the sewing machine.

Raising and Lowering the Presser Foot

⚠ CAUTION:

Do not turn the handwheel or press the needle up/ down button when the presser foot is in extra lifted position. This may cause damage to the presser foot.

The presser foot lifter raises and lowers the presser foot.

You can raise the presser foot about 6 mm (1/4") higher than the normal up position by exerting more pressure when lifting the presser foot lifter. This helps you to place layers of thick fabric.

- (1) Presser foot lifter
- (2) Down position
- (3) Up position
- (4) Extra lifted position

NOTE:

If you press the start/stop button without lowering the presser foot, the warning message appears on the visual touch screen.

Lower the presser foot lifter and press the start/stop button.



The knee lifter is extremely helpful when sewing patchwork, quilting, etc. since it allows you to handle the fabric while your knee controls the presser foot.

Attaching the knee lifter

Match the ribs on the knee lifter with the notches in the knee lifter socket and insert the knee lifter.

- (1) Knee lifter
- (2) Rib
- (3) Knee lifter socket

Adjusting the knee lifter

The angle of the knee lifter can be adjusted to fit the user. Loosen the setscrew and slide the angle bar in or out to adjust the angle of the knee lifter.


Tighten the setscrew to secure the angle bar.




Using the knee lifter


Push the knee lifter with your knee to easily move the presser foot up and down.


You can control how high the foot rises by the amount of knee pressure you exert.

















Adjusting Thread Tension

Select the stitch pattern to show the optimized thread tension.

NOTE:

- You may need to manually adjust the tension balance depending on the sewing conditions, or you can fine-tune the thread tension to suit your preference.
- Set the thread tension dial at "3" in the embroidery mode (refer to page 110).

Adjust the thread tension dial to the number shown on screen.

- (1) Turn the dial to smaller number, and the needle thread tension becomes weaker.
- (2) Turn the dial to bigger number, and the needle thread tension becomes stronger.

Balanced thread tension

Straight stitch: Both needle and bobbin threads interlock between the layers.

Zigzag stitch: The needle thread appears slightly on the wrong side of the fabric.

- (3) Needle thread
- (4) Bobbin thread
- (5) Right side of the fabric
- (6) Wrong side of the fabric


Needle thread tension is too tight:

Turn the dial to smaller number.

Needle thread tension is too weak:

Turn the dial to bigger number.




Correct tension

- (1) Right side (top side) of fabric
- (2) Wrong side (bottom side) of fabric


Minimize the amount of needle thread visible on the wrong side (bottom side) of the fabric without causing excessive puckering, or causing the bobbin thread to show on the right side (top side) of the fabric.

Results vary with fabric, thread and sewing conditions.




Tension is too tight

The corner of each zigzag point pulls together on the right side of the fabric.



Tension is too loose

The corner of each zigzag point pulls together on the wrong side of the fabric.




Adjusting Presser Foot Pressure

Select the stitch pattern to show the optimized presser foot pressure.

Adjust the presser foot pressure dial to the number shown on screen.

Replacing the Needle Plate





Fabric and Needle Chart

For Ordinary sewing

- For general sewing, use needle size 11/75 or 14/90.
- A fine thread and needle should be used for sewing lightweight fabrics, so the fabric will not be marred.
- Heavy weight fabrics require a needle large enough to pierce the fabric without fraying the needle thread.
- Always test the needle size on a small scrap of the fabric that will be used for actual sewing.
- In general, use the same thread for the needle and bobbin.




- When sewing stretch fabrics, very fine fabrics and synthetics, use a blue tip needle. The blue tip needle effectively prevents skipped stitches.
- For general embroidery, use a blue tip needle.
- Janome bobbin thread for embroidery is recommended for bobbin.











Winding the Bobbin Removing the Bobbin

Raise the presser foot lifter.

Slide the hook cover release button to the right, and remove the hook cover plate.

Drawing Up the Bobbin Thread

After using auto thread cutting or threading the bobbin holder, you can start sewing without drawing up the bobbin thread.

However, you need to draw up the bobbin thread when sewing gathering stitches, etc.




Sewing from the Edge of Thick Fabric

Straight Stitch Needle Plate

The straight stitch needle plate has two holes where the needle enters. The straight stitch needle plate is helpful to hold and support the fabric when the needle pierces the fabric. Use the straight stitch needle plate for better results.

It is recommended to use straight stitch needle plate when sewing straight stitches (U1-U5).




U2 Lock-a-Matic stitch




Use this stitch to secure the beginning and the end of a seam with backstitching.

When you reach the end of the seam, press the reverse button once.

The machine will sew four reverse stitches, four forward stitches, and then stop sewing automatically.


U3 Locking stitch




This unique stitch is used where an invisible locking stitch is needed.

U4 Straight stitch in left needle position


